Pleven, Bulgaria

Pleven is the seventh biggest city in Bulgaria. Located in the northern part of the country, it is the administrative centre of Pleven Province, as well as of the subordinate Pleven municipality. Internationally known for the Siege of Plevna of 1877, it is today a major economic centre of the Bulgarian Northwest and Central North and the third largest city of Northern Bulgaria after Varna and Rousse. In Pleven region there are more than 450 archeological and cultural sites, approximately 215 memorials of the Russian-Turkish Liberation War of 1877-1878.

THE SUMP

Establishment of balanced, economically efficient and environmentally friendly urban transport system based on modern ITC technologies and sustainable mobility measures.

SPECIFIC INDICATORS

- Reduction in CO2 equivalent, NOx, and PM 10 emissions by 20% in 8 years
- Increasing the use of PT by 10% in the next 7 years
- Reduction of road deaths by 20% in the next 7 years

LONG-TERM SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- Ensuring sustainable and environmentally friendly mobility in urban and peri-urban areas of Pleven
- Achieving maximum accessibility by introduction of economically efficient and safe urban transport

MID-TERM GOALS

- Improve the functionality of the urban transport system
- Introduction of energy efficient and environmentally friendly means of transportation
